
Paradox and pain in education

Outline of talk:

There are loud calls for change in education, including from employers. But it's hard to address the points of pain. James discusses this paradox and how small steps can lead to major change. He also identifies points of resistance in the educational system and how to overcome them, especially in MBA education.
